The Inca Trail, Cuzco & Machu Picchu

2005, PAPER, 288 PAGES, \$19.95

A practical guide to planning and walking the Inca Trail with good maps, lots of travel information, photographs and a brief overview of Inca culture and history. Not just for those hiking the Inca Trail, it's an excellent compact guide to Cusco, Machu Picchu, Lima and surroundings. This fully revised second edition includes the seven-to-ten day hike to Vilcabamba. (Item no. PRU19)

The Incas, People of the Sun

1994, PAPER, 192 PAGES, \$12.95

A pocket-size encyclopedia in the acclaimed "Discoveries" series, this jewel of a book features hundreds of archival drawings and photographs, a chronology and long excerpts from the journals of early explorers. It's a guide to the ancient monuments, daily life of the Incas, and history of exploration. (Item no. AND03)

Lost City of the Incas, The Story of Machu Picchu and its Builders

A first-rate tale of adventure by the man who rediscovered Machu Picchu in 1911. This classic account is a gripping story of exploration, archaeology and natural history -- and still an outstanding overview of the site itself. With original expedition photographs. Originally published in 1952, the book is still an excellent account, not only of the expedition but also of the site itself. (Item no. AND05)

Realm of the Incas

A spirited, photographic tour of the culture, monuments and festivals of the Inca. Milligan, who has traveled widely through Peru, goes beyond the typical pictures of Cusco and Machu Picchu in this stunning collection of photographs, all taken in natural light. Hemming (Conquest of the Incas) provides the lengthy forward. Milligan, who has a fondness for abstract images, includes photographs from the high Andes to the Amazon and coast. Author, explorer and archaeologist Thomson recounts twenty years spent journeying throughout the Andes of Peru, Bolivia and Ecuador in search of lost Inca cities. His engaging account is a pleasing mix of discovery, colorful personalities, history and archaeology (Item no. AND36)

Thornton Wilder

The Bridge of San Luis Rey

A classic by the Pulitzer Prize-winning American novelist, set in Peru 200 years ago. The story, about five travelers who are killed when a bridge built by the Incas collapses, is told from the point of view of a Franciscan missionary. (Item no. AND08)
