Return to Diversity: A Political History of East Central Europe Since World War II

An opinionated, well-written and clear political history of Poland, Czechoslovakia, Hungary, Yugoslavia, Romania, Bulgaria and Albania since WWII, completely revised for this third edition to reflect post-Soviet realities. (Item no. EUR31)

The Hungarians, A Thousand Years of Victory in Defeat

2004, PAPER, 664 PAGES, \$19.95

The author, a journalist who fled Hungary in 1957, combines history, scholarship and anecdote in this uncommonly engaging account. He covers, with verve and authority, the struggle of the Magyars' against the Tartars, Turks and Russians over the last 1,000 years. (Item no. HGR32)

Timothy Garton Ash

The Magic Lantern, The Revolution of '89 Witnessed in Warsaw, Budapest, Berlin, and Prague

1993, PAPER, 167 PAGES, \$13.95

An astute journalist's vividly reported eyewitness account of the fall of the Berlin Wall and other dramatic events of 1989. With a chapter each on Warsaw, Budapest, Berlin and Prague. (Item no. GER36)

Susan Rubin Suleiman

Budapest Diary, In Search of the Motherbook

1999, PAPER, 232 PAGES, \$14.95

A lovely and affecting memoir of a childhood in the 1940s Budapest and a return trip in 1993 as an academic fellow. Suleiman is now a professor at Harvard. (Item no. HGR37)

Don't be fooled by the title -- this engaging novel is set in Budapest. Five young American expats have settled themselves in what they consider the "second-best" eastern European city, where Kundera-esque chance encounters and interactions determine how their lives will -- or won't -- be changed. The Glance of Countess Hahn-Hahn (Down the Danube)

2000, PAPER, 246 PAGES, \$19.00

A confounding, postmodern novel, this meditation on travel, the Danube, and its history is great fun for those with an appreciation for wordplay and intellectual games. (Item no. HGR11)

Under the Frog

2001, PAPER, 256 PAGES, \$13.00

Irony and wit pervade this novel set against the backdrop of the short-lived Hungarian revolution of 1956. The author's own experiences are played out by a cast of Kafkaesque characters all looking for a way through the turbulent days before the Russian tanks roll into Budapest. (Item no. HGR12)

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
