A fictional account of the Holocaust told through the story of a young Czech Jew. (Item no. CZH43)

The deeply funny story of a hapless Czech soldier in the Austro-Hungarian army, dismissed for incompetence only to be pressed into service by the Russians in World War I, then captured by his own troops. (Item no. CZH11)

Kundera's intriguing novel, praised for its meditations on the nature of men and women, and the fearful emptiness of life in Prague under Communist management. (Item no. CZH16)
