An extensive timeline of Viennese history, suggested walks in the city, a chapter on day trips in the region, and helpful listings of accommodations, restaurants and shops are also included. Thomas Bernhard was a scathing voice in the modern European literary and theatre scenes. This novel is a satiric look at the Viennese art and music community, and a portrait of a disillusioned musicologist. (Item no. AST40)

**The Radetzky March**

This is perhaps the best-known and best-loved novel of the Habsburg Empire. First published in 1932, it spins a tale of three generations of the Trotta family set against the waning days of the empire. (Item no. AST17)

**The Road into the Open**

1992, PAPER, 314 PAGES, \$18.95

Set in fin-de-siecle Vienna, this novel, about the death of Austrian liberal society in an atmosphere of nationalism and anti-Semitism, features a handsome composer's encounters with intellectuals and artists. (Item no. AST02)

**The Third Man and the Fallen Idol**

A haunting tale and penetrating portrait of Vienna after World War II, "The Third Man" is the result of Greene's collaboration with Carol Reed on the classic movie. "The Fallen Idol" is a separate tale of intrigue set in Britain. (Item no. AST30)
