2006, PAPER, 336 PAGES, \$25.95

The Fate Of Africa

2005, HARD COVER, 752 PAGES, \$35.00

Ambitious in scope, immensely readable -- and as big as a doorstop -- Meredith Martin's overview of the tumult, horrors and strides made in Africa since independence is invaluable. (Item no. AFR154)

Thomas Pakenham

The Scramble for Africa

1992, PAPER, 738 PAGES, \$23.95

A well written, meticulously researched history of the Victorian land grab in Africa. The book includes especially good portraits of the egomaniacal personalities who overran the continent. (Item no. AFR26)

Ernest Hemingway

Green Hills of Africa

1935, PAPER, 295 PAGES, \$13.00

A classic, wonderfully readable tale of hunting in the Lake Manyara area. Hemingway paints a real life story of his ramblings in East Africa. Some of the best writing ever on the land itself. (Item no. EAF25)

Martin Dugard

Into Africa, The Epic Adventures of Stanley and Livingstone

2004, PAPER, 340 PAGES, \$14.95

A nicely paced tale of the Scottish explorer and Stanley's headline-grabbing efforts to locate him. Dugard has done his homework well, drawing on a wide variety of sources to paint a nuanced, lively portrait of the two men. (Item no. AFR130)

Shiva Naipaul

North of South, An African Journey

1979, PAPER, 349 PAGES, \$15.00

A sharp portrait of Africa, circa 1979. A brilliant and provocative observer, Naipaul meditates on the various peoples he encounters in Kenya, Tanzania and Zambia. The best, most insightful thing we've read about Africa. (Item no. EAF28)

Isak Dinesen

Out of Africa and Shadows on the Grass

1985, PAPER, 466 PAGES, \$13.95

The perennially best-selling tale of a naive young woman who leaves Denmark for East Africa, Out of Africa draws us into life on a struggling coffee plantation. It's a moving story inspired by affection for Kenya and its people. (Item no. EAF22)

Peter Matthiessen

The Tree Where Man Was Born

1972, PAPER, 430 PAGES, \$16.00

In this far-ranging book, we travel with Matthiessen to Maasailand, Ngorongoro Crater, the Kenyan Highlands and out in the bush to witness the animals. It is a classic, written in 1961. (Item no. EAF27)

Ole Saitoti

The Worlds of a Maasai Warrior, An Autobiography

1988, PAPER, 144 PAGES, \$19.95

The riveting account of an eventful life. Saitoti looks back on his life among the Maasai, as spokesperson for the tribe and one of their first safari guides. He bridges several worlds with tremendous grace. (Item no. EAF29)

Beryl Markham

West with the Night

1983, PAPER, 294 PAGES, \$15.00

A stylish and engrossing story of a marvelous life well lived. Markham describes her childhood in Kenya and her experiences as a bush pilot in the 1930s, evoking the landscapes, people and wildlife of East Africa in rich detail. (Item no. EAF10)

Chinua Achebe, Lynn Innes

Heinemann Book of Contemporary African Short Stories

1992, PAPER, 196 PAGES, \$11.95

A single-volume introduction to the vast literature of Africa, containing stories from the past 37 years. (Item no. AFR10)

William Boyd

An Ice-Cream War, A Novel

1999, PAPER, 416 PAGES, \$15.00

This finely wrought, sensitive novel captures the drama and day-to-day reality of friends and family caught up in WWI in German East Africa. (Item no. EAF146)

Alexander McCall Smith

The Girl Who Married a Lion and Other Tales from Africa

2004, HARD COVER, 192 PAGES, \$20.00

McCall Smith brings together folktales, often hilarious or bizarre, which he heard as a child growing up in Zimbabwe. (Item no. AFR141)

Ernest Hemingway

The Snows of Kilimanjaro And Other Stories

1995, PAPER, 156 PAGES, \$11.00

A collection of 10 excellent Hemingway stories set in Africa, including *The Snows of Kilimanjaro* and *The Short Happy Life of Francis Macomber*. Originally published in 1936, the book draws from stories written over the previous nine years, when Hemingway's prose was at its best; a classic not to be missed. (Item no. EAF26)

George Casey, James Earl Jones

Africa, The Serengeti

1994, DVD, \$19.99

A dazzling 40 minute IMAX documentary of the wildebeests' yearlong migration in the Serengeti and Masai Mara. The cinematographer captures all the action in stunning color, documenting birth, predation and fighting. James Earl Jones narrates. (Item no. EAF120)

Craig Packer

Into Africa, With a New Postscript

1996, PAPER, \$24.00

An account by a noted field biologist of two months among the animals at Serengeti and Gombe National Parks in Tanzania. (Item no. EAF77)

Jonathan Adams, Thomas McShane

The Myth of Wild Africa

1996, PAPER, 290 PAGES, \$21.95

The authors, associated with World Wildlife Fund, explode the romantic fallacy of an untouched continent where animals roam freely in sanctuaries. It's a no-holds-barred attack on old-style conservation in Africa. (Item no. AFR15)

George Schaller

The Serengeti Lion, A Study of Predator-Prey Relations

1972, PAPER, 480 PAGES, \$29.00

A classic study in field biology and winner of the National Book Award, this book is the result of Schaller's long-term study of the ecology of the Serengeti lion. (Item no. EAF13)

A Photographic Guide to the Birds of East Africa

2000, PAPER, 144 PAGES, \$15.95

A handy pocket field guide with 350 remarkably good photographs of the common birds of Kenya, Tanzania and Uganda. (Item no. EAF17)

A Photographic Guide, Southern, Central, and East African Mammals

2001, PAPER, 144 PAGES, \$15.95
